
We have different events planned for the Summer Term including Sports Days and a Family Social so I hope for good weather and look forward to seeing you there.



# Attendance

Attendance so far this academic year has been 91.6%. As an outstanding school, we have high expectations for all our students and our aspirations extend to levels of attendance.

The school day at Forest Way begins at **8.50am** with a registration period until 9.25am. Lessons begin promptly at **9.30am**. The school day ends at **3.20pm** and the latest time to collect your child is **3.40pm**, as the majority of staff leave or go into training at 3.45pm. For students who find transition difficult, arriving late can cause more anxiety if they do not have time in their class before moving on to their first lesson.

We work hard to provide an exciting and stimulating curriculum, and attendance is crucial for full access of this curriculum.

### Oaks 2










Oaks 9
